#### INVITE - WELCOME - CONNECT

Yesterday we had a great annual congregation meeting. Thanks to all those who have served during the past year and looking forward to working with all the committees, boards and groups. Now we prepare to move forward with even more exciting things in 2020. In order to remain a vital and growing church it is important to prayerfully keep in mind three things:

**INVITE** – Studies show that 80% of the new people who become involved in a church were first invited by a relative or friend. Prayerfully consider who you might invite or bring along with you to church or church activities. It doesn't have to be a Sunday. It could be to our Wednesday meal and worship or any activity or group.

**WELCOME** - Secondly it is important to give an extravagant welcome to everyone but especially to guests in worship and those who participate in groups or activities. Introduce yourself share your journeys of joy you have experienced here. I think we do a good job in this area but sometimes we forget and get so caught up in our conversations with long time friends that we fail to take the time necessary to make new people feel welcome.

**CONNECT** – Studies also show that unless new people connect and develop relationships with others in the church family, they will gradually stop coming to worship and church activities. It all starts with learning their names and listen to some of the stories they might share about their family, work or other interests. You might find something in common to enjoy together. The bottom line is building new relationships with new people.

New groups, studies, activities or service projects tend to be the best way of making more room for more people to build new relationships – so if you have a new idea for something new share it with me or some of the leaders and see if it can't become a reality. One of the things happening here, is how the existing groups and activities are welcoming of new people.
