Breaking the Silence on Mental Illness

In August I had a series of sermons and conversations about mental health issues such as depression, suicide. These are among the subjects and issues that we may feel uncomfortable with. We regularly pray and converse about all kinds of diseases but when it comes to brain diseases or mental health issues, many remain silent. This means those in despair are often left alone in their pain and suffering.

There has seldom been a time in my ministry that the response to a sermon series was so overwhelming as to the subject of mental health. It stimulated great conversations in the chancel, narthex, dining hall, hallways, parking lot, my office, and on the phone etc. I believe the Holy Spirit is trying to say something to me and our congregation. Namely, a lot of people are suffering silently with their mental and emotional pain. Perhaps we can help bring even more hope and healing in the future?

It was Jesus who paved the way in regard to a healing ministry for the whole person – not just our souls. One-third of his ministry was on healing the lame, blind, deaf, depressed, anxious, and guilt-ridden people everywhere he went. Just this past week the gospel lesson was on how he healed the women who was bent over with a disease that left her looking at the ground and her feet for 18 years.

This brief sermon and discussion series on the silence and pain around us is not the end. It is only the beginning of finding new ways to bring hope and healing in the hurting people around us everywhere.

Glad to be part of God's healing community here at First Congregational UCC.

Mark the calendar and be a part of history in our church! The question of when the baking of pasties will begin, is common whenever I meet someone that loves them. Proudly, I say, "Soon," with the first day of sales to be on Friday, Oct. 25.

The actual schedule will be as follows: Tuesday, Oct. 22: vegetables arrive; Wednesday, Oct. 23: preparation of the kitchen, the machines and setting up of the work rooms and first day of peeling vegetables; Thursday, Oct. 24: first day of baking; From then on, the routine continues of peeling and baking and selling until Tuesday, Nov. 5. Working hours begin around 9 a.m. and selling hours are 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Around 1,700 postcards will be in the mail the beginning of October, with phone orders called in immediately after. Our customers are eager and cannot wait to buy hot, cooled or frozen pasties. They may buy only one or a dozen. Or, more for a party or to have on hand in the freezer. We, in turn, are eager to see them again as return customers and to hear their praise of our outstanding product. Our church has had the pleasure of being a part of this fantastic project the past twenty-two years, providing delicious pasties to thousands in Southeastern Michigan.
